3 Points of Clarification

- Matthew 24 uses Greek Parousia [coming] concerned with Jesus coming to be present with us again Other Scriptures use Greek Apakalypsis [coming] – "to disclose or bring to light"
- 2) We haven't answered "What will be the sign?" yet. Eschatology – the study of things to come; doctrine of the 'last things'
- 3) Why did God give us these prophetic writings?
 - i. Encouragement/ edification of the church
 - ii. Evangelism/ to win the lost
 - iii. Jesus said so that no one leads you astray. (v. 4)
- Matthew 24:5-14 must be read in light of v. 4

- 1) Why neglect those who have not heard at all for the sake of those who have rejected it?
- 2) Who else will proclaim the gospel where it has yet to be heard?
- So what will be the sign? Jesus answers the question later in Matthew.
 - The fact of Christ's return "demands constant expectancy and, as our blessed hope, motivates the believer to godly living, sacrificial service and energetic mission." – (VBC statement of faith #9b)
 - Keep your focus on Christ, learning and understanding what He taught (all of it!), and proclaiming that truth to everyone

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- Matthew 24:5-14 must be read in light of v. 4
- Don't be led astray when you see these things:
 - 1. Many false **Christs** lead many astray (v. 5)
 - 2. Hear of wars and rumors of wars, famines, earthquakes all over (v. 6-8)
 - 3. Tribulation, death, **hated** by the nations for Christ's name (v. 9)
 - 4. Many will **fall away**, betray, and hate each other (v. 10)
 - 5. Many false **prophets** lead many astray (v. 11)
 - 6. <u>Lawlessness</u> increases. <u>Love</u> of many grows cold. (v. 12)
- These are <u>not</u> to be taken as signs of Jesus' <u>impending</u> return!
 - Note all the "manys"
 - "the end is not yet" (v. 6)
 - "these are but the beginning..." (v. 7)
 - So what is it? Jesus does not want you to be led astray. Rather...
 - 1. You must endure all the way to the end! (v. 13)
 - 2. You must **proclaim** the Gospel of the Kingdom of Jesus Christ! (v. 14)
