- Changing statement of faith?
 - *We believe in the personal, bodily and premillennial **glorious** return of our Lord Jesus Christ. The coming of Christ, at a time known only to God, demands constant expectancy and, as our blessed hope, motivates the believer to godly living, sacrificial service and energetic mission.*
 - “Even though existing member churches will not be required to adopt the revised Statement of Faith, the Conference expects that every church will seriously consider the desirability of adopting the revised Statement of Faith out of a spirit of commitment to the EFCA and to each other. This would be in keeping with the intent of the EFCA Bylaws, which state that all Evangelical Free churches have a common Statement of Faith.”


Millennial Reign. What does it even mean?

- Jesus’ disciples wondered if Jesus was going to restore the **Kingdom** to Israel (Acts 1:6-8)
- Revelation 20 describes a **thousand** year reign of Jesus at Jerusalem.
 - John’s vision of “what must take place after this” (Rev. 4:1) in Rev. 20, must shape our understanding.

Basic **Outline of Rev. 20** (the Millennial Reign)

- 1) Angel comes down from heaven and throws **Satan** bound into the bottomless pit for 1,000 years (**v. 1-3**)
 - a. Satan shut up and **sealed** in this pit
 - b. Satan no longer able to **deceive** nations
 - i. Implication 1: He *currently* deceives the nations
 - ii. Implication 2: There will continue to be “nations” on the earth during the millennium

- c. Satan will be released for a **little while**
- 2) Thrones of judgment and the presence and activity of **saints** who have died (v. 4-6)
- Some [non-descript] persons given authority to sit on thrones to **judge**
 - “Souls” of those beheaded (executed) for their persistent faith, not worshipping the beast, and not taking the mark of the beast on their forehead or hands came to life to **reign** with Christ 1,000 years.
 - Others who died come to life at the **end** of the 1,000 years (“others” seems to refer to those who were not saved)
 - Those resurrected for the 1,000 year reign are:
 - Part of the “first resurrection” (v. 5b)
 - “Blessed and holy” (v. 6a)
 - Not subject to second death (hell) (v. 6b)
 - To become priests (v. 6c)
 - To reign with Christ 1,000 years (v. 6d).
- 3) The millennial reign has a definite start and **end** (v. 7-10)
- 1,000 year reign of Christ with His saints.**



- Satan **released** from the Bottomless Pit (v. 7)
 - Satan **deceives** the nations one more time and musters up an army to attack the saints (v. 8-9a)
 - Implication 1: There will be unsaved folks living during the 1,000 year reign – lots of them
 - Implication 2: The rule of the saints with Christ will be from Jerusalem (that beloved city).
 - Implication 3: The saints will be “camped” together around Jerusalem.
- 4) The **Great White Throne** Judgment follows the millennial reign (v. 11-15)
- All the **unsaved**, “great” and “small,” stand before the throne of Jesus to be judged according to what they have done, as recorded in books (v. 11-13).

- b. Death, Hades, and those not written in the Book of Life thrown into the **lake of fire** (v. 14-15).


