Conclusion/Application

The importance of the document:

- 6) In the hand of the **Lord God Almighty**
- 7) In the *right* hand representing God's <u>rule</u> and <u>authority</u>.
- 8) A message to be opened by **authorized** Person only
- 9) No <u>created</u> being was worthy to open it
- 10)Only the <u>uncreated</u> eternally existing Son of God was worthy

What this says about Jesus:

➤ He <u>will be</u> (future tense) vindicated and receive His rightful inheritance for His work on earth

"Come up here, and I will show you what must <u>take place after</u> <u>this</u>." (Rev. 4:1)

What it means for us:

- > Those who trust in Jesus have a share in Jesus' inheritance
- Those who reject Jesus have <u>no share</u> in the inheritance and will be punished as <u>enemies!</u>
