Pastor's Note: John 7 describes the confusion over Jesus' identity. In the middle of that, Jesus clarifies to His audience (and John clarifies to his readers sixty years later) not just who He is, but also what He came to do. The question, "Who is This Jesus?" is really more about what He does in, for, and *through* the believer, than it is about His identity.
