 - a. Jesus has authority over all flesh to give <u>eternal life</u> to those the Father gave to Him for the <u>glory</u> of the Father through the Son (v. 1-5)

- 1.) Addressed to **<u>righteous</u>** Father (v. 25a)
- 2.) The world does not know the Father (v. 25b)
- 3.) The disciples knew that Father sent Jesus (v. 25c)
- 4.) Jesus made the Father known to them and would <u>continue</u> to do so (v. 26a) (cf. Jn. 14:6-7)
- 5.) The purpose of it all: *that the love with which* [Father] loved [the Son] may be in them, and [the Son] in them. (v.26b)

Three blockades to oneness with Jesus

- Intimacy with Jesus but ignoring the aspect of togetherness with other believers in a church.
- Busy fellowshipping with other believers never spending time alone with Jesus.
- > Never truly believing in Jesus.

Pastor's Note: John 17 records Jesus' prayer just before He was arrested. We learn much from this prayer about our walk with Jesus.
