 - C. Jesus' **prayer** for His own (17:1-26)
 - 1. Praying for those God gave Jesus who He personally disciplined (v. 1-19)
 - a. Jesus has authority over all flesh to give **eternal life** to those the Father gave to Him for the **glory** of the Father through the Son (v. 1-5)
 - 1.) God is glorified through the Son's **authority** over all flesh (v. 1-2)
 - 2.) Eternal life is **knowing** God and Jesus (v. 3)
 - 3.) Jesus would be **glorified** in the presence of the Father (v. 4-5) (cf. Jn. 1:1-3)
 - b. Jesus manifested the Father's name to those the Father gave to Jesus (v. 6-11)
 - 1.) God gave people to Jesus who **were already** God's. (v. 6)
 - 2.) Jesus gave them **God's** words and they believed God **sent** Him [to do that]. (v. 7-8)
 - 3.) Jesus prayed for them to be **one** as the Father and Son are **one**. (v. 9-11)
 - c. Jesus asks the Father to keep them (v. 12-19)
 - 1.) Jesus had guarded them (v.12)
 - i. Only the "son of destruction" had been lost
 - ii. It fulfilled Scripture
 - 2.) Jesus prayed that they would have **His joy** fulfilled in themselves (v.13)
 - 3.) Jesus asked that the Father **sanctify** them in the truth (His **word**) (v. 15-19)
 - 2. Praying for those who would follow Jesus by the testimony of His disciples (v. 20-26)
 - a. That their "**oneness**" would reflect that of the Father and Son so that the **world** may believe (v. 20-23)
 - b. That they may be with **Jesus** and see His **glory** (v. 24)
 - c. That God's love for Jesus would be in them and Jesus would be in them (v. 25-26)

- 1.) Addressed to **righteous** Father (v. 25a)
- 2.) The **world** does not know the Father (v. 25b)
- 3.) The **disciples** knew that Father sent Jesus (v. 25c)
- 4.) Jesus made the Father known to them and would **continue** to do so (v. 26a) (cf. Jn. 14:6-7)
- 5.) The purpose of it all: *that the love with which [Father] loved [the Son] may be in them, and [the Son] in them.* (v.26b)

Three blockades to oneness with Jesus

- Intimacy with Jesus but ignoring the aspect of togetherness with other believers in a church.
- Busy fellowshiping with other believers never spending time alone with Jesus.
- Never truly believing in Jesus.

Pastor's Note: John 17 records Jesus' prayer just before He was arrested. We learn much from this prayer about our walk with Jesus.
