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- I. God loved the world by sending Jesus (Jn. 3:16) (1 Jn. 4:19)
 - A. Jesus' coming demonstrated God's love.
 - 1. Allowing something that appears "bad" does not necessarily mean a **failure** to love.
 - 2. God told us so will you trust Him at His word?
 - B. God satisfied His own <u>wrath</u> (propitiation) by sending Jesus. (1 Jn. 4:9-10, Rom. 5:8)
- II. How are we to respond to this love?
 - A. Don't reject it.
 - 1. We can meet Jesus!
 - 2. Jesus can identify with us (Heb. 4:15)
 - B. **Reflect** it. (1 Jn. 4:11, Eph. 4:29-32)
 - C. Eph. 4:29-32
 - D. Be <u>regulated</u> by it. (2 Cor. 5:12-15, 17-18)
- III. The results/purpose of this love.
 - A. Reveal it (outward/ evangelistic) (1 Thess. 2:1-8)
 - B. Be <u>united</u> in it (inward/fellowship) (Eph. 4:15-16)
 - 1. "The <u>truth</u>," which is not always what we want to hear or necessarily want to speak.
 - 2. "In <u>love</u>," which is the motivation for speaking that truth.

 This is not a self-serving love, but a love under the control of Christ's love.
- IV. <u>Communion</u> strengthens this love. (1 Cor. 10:1-5, 14-17)
 - A. Moses and the Exodus were precursors to the **church** (1 Cor. 10:1-5)
 - 1. They followed **CHRIST**! (v. 4)
 - 2. They did it **together** and were bound in unity by it. (v. 1-4)
 - 3. Most of them fell into sin. (v. 5-13)
 - B. Modern followers should learn from this (1 Cor. 10:14-17).
 - 1. Run away from the sins so prevalent in society! (v. 14)
 - Partake of the communion elements as a reflection/remembrance of Jesus' sacrifice and your <u>participation</u> in that through faith (v. 17b)
 - 3. The **unifying** impact of communion (v. 17c)
 - C. <u>Breaking bread</u> together [in the sense of eating a meal] builds community, too! (Acts 2:45-47)
