- Why Ecclesiastes?
 - God is doing something
 - Teaching us about walking with <u>Jesus</u> (through <u>John's</u> gospel)
 - Blessing us with <u>difficulties</u> (individually and corporately)
 - Some are struggling with **futility** ("vanity") of life
 - In these <u>last days</u> these feelings increase!
 - o Ecclesiastes has something to offer all of us.
 - It <u>challenges</u> the commonly accepted idea that if a person does "<u>good things</u>," "<u>good things</u>" generally happen to that person.
 - There is an easily <u>overlooked</u> and powerful message underlying the book.
